

GREAT MASSINGHAM ALLOTMENT ASSOCIATION (GMAA)

Précis of Allotment Rules

The following is a brief summary of the Allotment Rules.

The plotholder agrees to:

- Keep the allotment clean and in a good state of cultivation;
- Not cause any nuisance or annoyance to other plot holders or neighbouring properties, or use any form of violence, either physical or verbal;
- Not assign any part of the allotment to anyone else;
- Not cut any trees or remove any soil from the plot;
- Keep hedges trimmed, and maintain in good repair any fences or gates on the plot;
- Not erect any structures (other than a small shed or greenhouse) without written consent from the Parish Council;
- Not use barbed wire for fencing adjoining any path;
- If having a bonfire, burn only allotment waste, taking particular care not to cause nuisance to neighbouring properties, especially as regards wind direction and washing on lines;
- Bring to the attention of the Allotment Committee any nuisance behaviour which could be considered a criminal offence, for reporting to the Parish Council and the Police, who will have the final say in any disagreements.

Failure to abide by the above may result in the plotholder being given one month's notice to quit their plot.
