## Great Massingham Playgrounds

The refurbished 'Under 5s' play area in Great Massingham is now complete and reopened on 18<sup>th</sup> March giving local families an exciting new space to enjoy. This £70,000 phase of the project has been funded by Lottery Awards for All and the Borough Council of King's Lynn and West Norfolk and marks a major step forward in improving the village play facilities for younger children. The new area has been designed to be safer, more welcoming and better suited to local families, and we are very grateful to everyone who has helped make it possible.



We are also delighted to confirm that phase 2, the major upgrade to the 'Over 5s' area, has now started, with an impressive **£240,000** raised through support from the National Lottery Reaching Communities Fund and the FCC Community Fund. This next phase will include a large hilltop adventure tower, slides, from the existing mound, two zip wires, a baby zip wire, an accessible in-ground trampoline, group and additional swings, a covered outdoor classroom pergola, a fireman's pole, inclusive surfacing, paths, signage, bins, seating, trees and landscaping! The aim is to have the new 'Over 5s' area complete for **1st August 2026**, opening with a big village celebration – Save the date!

This role includes a small payment and involves:

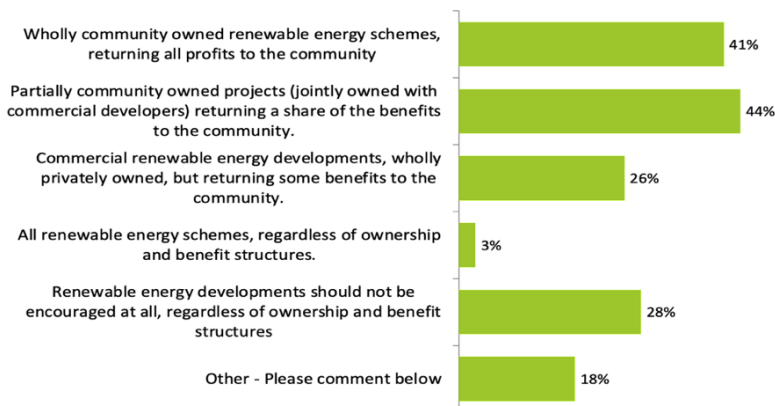
- Taking payment of fees from anglers for their daily licences,

## Great Mass'm Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP)

Many thanks to the 41 Online Renewable Energy Survey respondents following the Community Conversation on possible schemes. A real breadth of views and opinions identified several aspects for further consideration. Just over a quarter of the answers supported wind turbine generation, a fifth anaerobic digestion, with solar farms, digestion from waste, and district heating schemes proving less popular.

Responses about possible ownership arrangements (respondents could choose more than one option hence % values) are illustrated below:

# Great Massingham Parish Council Meetings

## Parish Council Meeting – 16th March

### Main decisions

Councillors approved first registration of the Weasenham Road village green land and agreed not to take on maintenance of the Owen Cole Close play area as it is private and covered by existing property arrangements. Council also continued to challenge the disputed SSE streetlighting account (concern that the parish may have been overbilled) and agreed to pursue this further with SSE, UK Power Networks and, if needed, the Energy Ombudsman. The HTB account is to be closed at maturity, with funds transferred to Unity Trust.

### Surgery land and village projects

Councillors agreed to submit the surgery land to BCKLWN's Call for Sites for an initial no-obligation assessment of its development potential. This will help the council understand what options may exist, while keeping any future decisions under Parish Council control. Other live projects included further work on the 'Over5s' play area, highways matters, biodiversity, village green protection signage, the neighbourhood plan and preparations for clerk interviews later in March.

### Finance and administration

The council approved a move to Scribe accounting software, agreed changes to training and website arrangements, and approved the March payments, including staffing, village hall hire, planning health check work and other routine costs.

### Playground project moves forward

The extraordinary meeting focused entirely on the village playground project. Councillors were told the 'Under5s' area was due for completion on 25 March, subject to final ROSPA sign-off, and that the final CAPCO invoice of £42,000 was awaiting approval. FCC funding of £140,000 had now been awarded, taking total confirmed playground funding to £310,000. Phase 2 will include replacement and new accessible equipment, including swings, ziplines, a tower, accessible trampoline and roundabout, while still allowing space for a future MUGA.

### Delegated powers agreed

The council agreed delegated powers for the playground subgroup so it can respond quickly to funder queries, approve third party contribution, progress contracts and sign off designs where needed. Councillors also noted the need to recover outstanding VAT, update insurance once equipment is installed and confirm some final design details such as surfacing and seating.

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## Massingham Village Fund Initiative

Following the success of the first 4 years of the Massingham Village Fund Initiative, we are inviting applications as beneficiaries for VFI.05 (2026–27).

Applicants must be a properly constituted organisation with their own bank account, based in Great or Little Massingham and primarily benefiting the Massingham villages. Non-political and not for profit.

Application deadline **31<sup>st</sup> May 2026**. Successful applicants will be advised by 14<sup>th</sup> June. The funding year runs 1<sup>st</sup> June 2026 to 31<sup>st</sup> May 2027.

We are continuing with the Small Fund Pot for groups needing a one-off payment rather than year-long funding. This pot will be one of the VFI beneficiaries.

**All existing beneficiaries must re-apply for the forthcoming year.**

To the end of November 2025, the pub raised an incredible £22,553 - shared equally between its chosen charities (Retina UK, RNLI Wells-next-the-Sea, and East Anglian Air Ambulance) and the VFI. So £11,276.50 so far for VFI, all from just £1 added per bill. The Shop and Cartshed also contributed an amazing £500.18 from customers' loose change alone. Two quarters' results are still to come.
