Response from The Village Hall to Suggestions made by Villagers as part of the Neighbourhood Development Plan Initial Questionnaire.....

The Neighbourhood Development Plan consultation, asked for likes, dislikes, hopes & suggestions for the Village that should be developed in the coming years. The results of the initial survey are published on www.greatmassinghamndp.co.uk Suggestions relating to the Village Hall have been passed to the Hall Trustees & Bar Directors and their responses/plans are included below.

We are pleased to read, from the responses, that the Hall and Bar are highly valued assets.

Firstly, we hope everyone appreciates the Hall reserves have been severely curtailed due to two periods of lockdown that, effectively, closed the Hall and Bar for fifteen months, over two financial years. We still face challenging times ahead with inflation and energy costs rocketing. Steps have been taken to reduce the running costs, including negotiating a fixed term electricity contract, saving money on the intruder alarm and fire precautions, without, of course, compromising safety. Sometimes, we have also changed suppliers.

Cancelling the bottle banks as they were no longer viable has been another change.

Secondly, regarding the facilities offered at the Hall, all things are possible if they can be afforded and maintained in a planned and costed way. Raising funds is always a challenge.

<i>Update the Hall and the Bar</i>	The Bar Directors are always looking for ways of making the bar a more welcoming place. During the periods of lockdown, the directors and volunteers redecorated the bar. We would still like to replace the carpets and this is probably the next improvement.
<i>Bicycle racks for the Hall</i>	There was a section to park bicycles but this was abandoned when people were injuring themselves by tripping or turning an ankle.
<i>Electric car charging points.</i>	These are something the Hall trustees are considering but would need an initial outlay and additional funding.
<i>Bring back football.</i>	Here your wishes have been granted. Please support the team.
<i>Organise more sport occasions.</i>	The Trustees are happy to support any sound proposals for additional sporting events.
<i>More outdoor facilities ie. table tennis tables.</i>	The trustees are happy to consider additional facilities ie. outdoor table tennis tables, if our end of financial year figures show the Hall and Bar to be back in profit and our reserves in better shape.
<i>Move chip van to the Hall Car Park.</i>	We have discussed the possibility of the Chip Van parking at the Village Hall but, sadly, the steepness of the drive rules this out.
<i>A Multiuse Games Area (MUGA)</i>	The Trustees have investigated the possibility of a MUGA but the cost to install at £150,000 to £200,000 is beyond the Hall's means.
<i>Allow bouncy castles for inside parties.</i>	The answer to this one is no. Our insurance would not cover this - too dangerous a risk of children falling onto the hard wooden floor.
<i>More Cash Bingo.</i>	The Trustees have reinstated Cash Bingo at the Hall

The next project at the Hall is to provide a better space for the Community Cars and, at the same time, improve the appearance and insulation of the north wall. You also might have noticed, the tennis courts are being refurbished thanks to funds from the 'Tennis and Multisports Club' and the 'Norfolk Community Foundation'.

The Staff, Trustees and Directors at the Hall continue to work hard to make more improvements, despite the many pressures. With your support, this year is looking much better and we are optimistic for the future. Thanks you.

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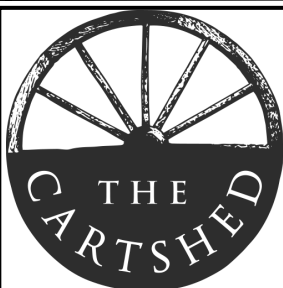
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GREAT MASSINGHAM PARISH COUNCIL - OCTOBER MEETING

The meeting, held on the 10th October was attended by eight Councillors, four parishioners and our Borough Councillor, Jim Moriarty.

FREE ‘Food for thought’ sessions.

Our Borough Councillor J. Moriarty reported that free food sessions to help residents trying to make ends meet, due to increasing food costs, had returned. Lily, a service that is owned and managed by the Borough Council of King’s Lynn & West Norfolk, was organising the interactive sessions with partners Freebridge Housing Association and the College of West Anglia from external funding received from The East Coast Community Fund. The ‘Food for thought’ sessions are held most Fridays, 9:30am to 11:30am at North Lynn’s Discovery Centre to help residents cook healthy and nutritious meals, on a budget, plus tasting sessions and blind taste tests and comparing alternatives to some of the costly big brands.

Free sessions are to take place Fridays from 9.30am to 11.30am, as follows:

November: 4th - Supermarket Swaps, 11th - Batch Cooking, 18th - Dietary Alternatives, and 25th - Low Calorie Cooking.

December: 2nd - Low-cost Desserts, 9th - Fake-away Meals and 16th - Seasonal Savings

Bunding Work, Village Green

Norfolk County Council completed the work to bund the verges to the greens leading to the junction opposite St Mary’s Church in August. The aim is to deter parking along this stretch of the greens and to prevent further erosion of the verges. Although the bunding solution might not be a perfect solution, it is the Parish Council’s only option in the short term to protect that area of green. NCC Highways have kindly funded this, quite costly, work. The Parish Council asks residents if they could respect the work that has been carried out and use some common sense when driving in that particular area. The area will then establish and the work will then do the job its intended to do.

Please note: Highways will be carrying out some remedial works, over the coming weeks, to sweep the area and repair and reseed the damaged parts.

When this work has been carried out, please could we ask members of the public to keep off the banks (even on foot or bicycle) while the grass is establishing.

Finance: During the last month, the external audit of the Council’s finances has been completed by PKF Littlejohn LLP who concluded that the Council had followed proper practices and relevant legislation, with no matters giving cause for concern. The external auditors report is available on the website and Village notice board.

Planning Applications: Two applications were considered at the September meeting.

Play Area: Some remedial work will be undertaken to the play equipment very shortly. This will include,

- the replacement of the damaged foot boards and seating to the Rocking Horse.
- installation of rubber matting/wearpads at high traffic areas underneath the Seesaw.
- anti-roosting measures will be added to the tops of the flat seat swings and the swing seats will be replaced.
- a new handle/chain and seat will be added to the trackway
- the rope and missing plastic caps will be replaced on the Toddler Multiplay.
- new footrests/handgrips will be added to the Rocker (Horse Springer)

Quotations are being sought and options being considered to replace the Train in the Toddlers Play Area. We hope to apply for some funding from the CIL Infrastructure Fund in the New Year in order to assist with the costs involved.

The next meeting will be on the 14th November , at 7.30pm, at the Village Hall.

News Report for the First Half of Term

FOSPGM October Report

Summer's almost gone. Autumn is upon us.....

It was a dramatic summer with temperatures hitting 40 degrees with local ponds drying out. Ponds drying out isn't such a bad thing, providing the wild life is looked after but taking the opportunity to do a bit of desilting was brilliant. All the Ponds and Pits will benefit by allowing a better flow of water through the pond network.

The FOSPGM faithful work team did their best, although a few meets were cancelled due to the excessive heat. We are getting close to half the Pit bank being repaired and made safe although recent examinations along the Station Road side have revealed some very deep undercuts necessitating extra work and a change of plan on the restoration.

The one metre edge is now being adhered to, bringing Scotsman's in line with the other ponds and creating a safety buffer. The Anglers tell us that the fishing is good and the extra cover around the edge is appreciated. Thank You.

We must give a big Thank You to the new Great Massingham Village Fund Charity who donated £127 to FOSPGM. This will allow us to purchase 10 metres of Willow Hurdles that are used to hold the bank underfill in place until the plant roots take hold.

As always, come along on any Friday morning to Scotsman's Pit to see what we are doing and ask questions. It is your pit so please support it. Bob Bones

November and our autumn days turn slowly into winter, as we approach the end of the year. Our hedgerows have been ablaze with fruit and colour. Our fruit trees have been full of apples, pears, and plums. Nature's bounty in abundance. It even tempted me to make some crab apple jelly this year, although I have to admit... it looks a little cloudy. Maybe a little more patience and expertise is needed next year.

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Biodiversity Project News

Work parties in September concentrated on cutting and then clearing the meadow. This is important to remove as much nutrient from the site as possible, whilst the cutting and raking helps to ensure that plenty of seed from this year's flowers reaches the ground for next year. Some of this is germinating already but much of it will die off over the winter and rotovating the area next spring will stimulate further seed into growth.

Some re-seeding will be needed at the Sandy Lane end to combat the damage caused by there being so many ducks in that area. Overhanging branches that were shading the meadow have been removed from one of the hedgerow trees. October and November tasks are

focused on removing some of the boughs shading the pond and bank on the south side. Plants struggle to grow in the shade beneath the large willow and this is causing the bank to erode more easily. Attendance at a recent Norfolk Wildlife Trust ponds workshop in Brisley was useful for prompting this work.

We recently welcomed visitors from CPRE Norfolk to see the Biodiversity Project and the main ponds in the village centre. This was part of an all-day event themed around

nature recovery and organised jointly between CPRE and Wild East, hosted by Olly Birkbeck at Little Massingham Estate. The programme included a first-hand look at the regenerative farming methods used on the estate as well as the heathland restoration project that will be further expanded next year. Speakers included Andy Miller of Natural England and it was good to have his endorsement of our project as well as much positive feedback from other attendees. Some even enjoyed an impromptu tour of Andrew Bickerton's garden!



This month's working party will be on Saturday 19th November at 10am when any new volunteers will be welcome. Please contact me if you would like to be added to our mailing list and help to maintain this site for the village.
