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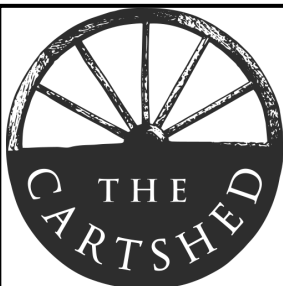

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GREAT MASSINGHAM PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council meeting began at 7.30pm on Monday 11th September, with eight Parish Councillors in attendance, seven members of the public and the Borough Councillor Alistair Beales were also present.

During the last month, the external audit of the Council's finances has been completed by PKF Littlejohn LLP who concluded that the Council had followed proper practices and relevant legislation, with no matters giving cause for concern. The external auditors report is available on the Parish Council website and notice board.

The Parish Council in liaison with Norfolk County Council are currently investigating the feasibility and the costs involved in the placement of part-time 20mph signs with flashing warning lights, outside the school. The County Council generally supports these as they do show a moderate reduction in average speeds during peak times. The scheme, if agreed, will be delivered through funding obtained from the Parish Partnership Scheme, where both the County Council and Parish Council contributes to half of the cost.

The Parish Council has also noted concerns from a number of parishioners regarding the grass cutting on the village greens. The Council has acknowledged that given the combination of wet weather and issues with the appointed grounds maintenance contractor CGM Landscapes the grass has at certain points not looked at its best. The Council are very disappointed with the standard of the work and are in the process of going to tender to appoint another contractor.

The Borough Council of King's Lynn & West Norfolk (BCKLWN) consultation on the 2024/25 Council Tax Support Scheme is now open and can be found at www.west-norfolk.gov.uk/ctsconsultation. The BCKLWN want to make their scheme more generous so that they can give, not only more help, but also extend its range so that more people will be eligible. They would therefore like to encourage residents to read the details, complete the survey and make any additional comments you may have.

DID YOU KNOW.....that Priority Setting Meetings (previously called SNAP) are held every three months by the Police for members of the public/councillors to raise any local issues or concerns they may have with their local beat managers. The next Priority Setting Meeting for the Hunstanton, Dersingham and The Woottons area will be held on Wednesday 4th October at 7pm. It will be held in person at Hunstanton Town Hall or you are able to join by emailing EOKingsLynn@norfolk.police.uk.

Next Meeting: *The next Parish Council meeting will be held in the Village Hall on 9th October, 2023 at 7.30pm. Members of the public are very welcome to join the meeting and there is an opportunity to make comments or ask questions of the Council during the first part of the meeting.*

COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH TEAM

There are now 13 members of Great Massingham Speed Watch team. This means we can do more sessions throughout the village and hopefully decrease the number of vehicles that regularly speed and cause serious safety concerns.

As we will now be able to run two teams Norfolk Police are providing us with extra equipment including a camera and Speed Watch signs. Of the two teams Team A will concentrate on Castle Acre Road and Weasenham Road while the second team will focus on Station Road at the Green and opposite the fire station.

Vehicles travelling in excess of 35 mph will receive a notification from the police. If a vehicle is reported three times in Norfolk an officer will visit to give a final warning. Certain parts of the UK have introduced a 20mph speed limit. What a good idea!

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BIODIVERSITY PROJECT NEWS

The dredging of School Pond at the Biodiversity Project was timed to perfection last month. The heavily silted pond had dried out during the hot weather which made it easier to work with and remove. Despite the heavy equipment in use, the pond bed was very carefully scraped back to its original clay profile by the Loane brothers, the work having been arranged by the Parish Council.

Just 48 hours later the pond was transformed and more than half filled with newly fallen rain!

Encroaching reed and a huge amount of recently colonised purple loosestrife had to be removed but edge plants will re-grow and what looks like brutal work will soon heal over. A lot of tall vegetation was removed and this has created an opportunity to keep some more open views over the pond from the road and green. Project volunteers will be working on this through the coming months. Our thanks to all involved in arranging and carrying out this much needed work.

This is one of our new barriers being used to help underpin where the bank is in danger of collapsing. It will be fitted correctly, back filled and then planted with native wild plants that have long roots they will naturally hold the barrier in place.

The roots will take up to 2 years to establish themselves. But then we can safely remove most of the bankside vegetation. In various forms this is what has been happening around the Pit for the last 2 years. As a result next year we will need less of the taller bankside plants! Great to see this progress.

THE NORFOLK WRITERS' EXCHANGE WELCOMES NEW MEMBERS

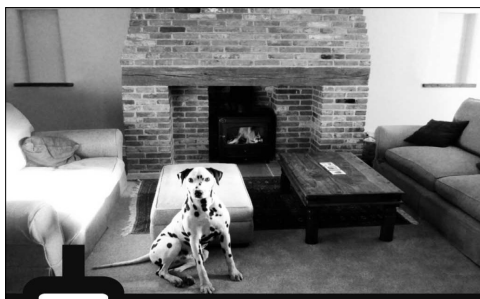

Church Clock Repair Update from the Cumbria Clock Co.

The Cumbria Clock Company has apologised for the delay in preparing the revised quotation for the restoration of the dials and for any inconvenience or embarrassment that this may have caused.

Following a visit to the Church the company agreed that the repairs to the fly fan assembly would be undertaken free of charge and returned to the site in the coming weeks. Church members were also made aware of concerns over the movement and it was advised that a major

overhaul should be undertaken within the 3 years. This was recommended due to a lot of wear within the bearings that would eventually lead to poor timekeeping and the eventual stopping of the clock. A budget price for the work was estimated at between £7,000 to £8,000. A quotation received to restore one dial was estimated at £9,720 plus VAT. A quotation to restore the second dial was estimated at £5,080 plus VAT.

The Cumbria Clock Company apologised again for not providing the quotations sooner but explained that their experienced clock horologist that had undertaken the inspection had retired due to ill health after making his report.
