MASSINGHAM HISTORICAL SOCIETY'S SEPTEMBER EXHIBITION IMPRESSED IT'S MANY VISITORS

Anthony Robinson, founder and senior archivist of the Historical Society, has been collecting photographs of the village and village life for over 35 years. Together with his wife Jeanne and others, the society has been steadily organising and annotating this vast, fascinating archive and presenting it, section by section, at its monthly meetings in the Village Hall. However, the Society's biennial exhibitions in St Mary's church create the opportunity to show what is being accomplished in its totality. This year's two-day exhibition (Saturday 13th & Sunday 14th September) was impressive both in scale and in the meticulous descriptions of the great many photographs. There was sufficient material to occupy both the nave and chancel (see photograph by Joanne Arnold). Furthermore, the organisation into distinct and meaningful sections gave varied yet focussed insights into the lives of residents and into the places they lived, worked and enjoyed themselves. The displays ranged from an account of the history of Massingham Heath, to the local railway, the Brownies and Guides, past trades and tradesmen, St Mary's church, Andrew Bickerton's pantomime productions, RAF Massingham, the Massingham Fire Brigade, and much more. Almost every facet of the village's past was covered. Not surprisingly, the exhibition was busy throughout the weekend and groups of friends were often seen gathered around a particular display, sharing their memories before moving on to enjoy excellent tea and cakes in the west nave. We are very fortunate to have our village's past documented in this way. But it's a never-ending chronicle and the Society is always pleased to receive photographs and artifacts that show still more of the Massingham's' compelling story.

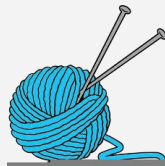

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SWLA MASSINGHAM HEATH PROJECT NEWS

Since the August events in the village, a number of artists have visited again and produced further work to record life on the Heath. Among them has been Dafila Scott, daughter of the great conservationist and founder of the World Wildlife Fund, Sir Peter



Scott. Dafila has been particularly drawn to the livestock and here has drawn the herd of Bagot goats. A large selection of the artworks will be heading to London next month to be part of the Society's annual exhibition *The Natural Eye* at the Mall Galleries, very near to Admiralty Arch. This will be featured in a special exhibit known as the

Out of the Frame Room, showing the work as it was produced in the field, along with information about Massingham Heath, the artists and project.

Massingham Heath has also provided the cover design for the exhibition catalogue and will appear in advertising. A beautiful silk screen print of a summer view across Massingham Heath by Carry Akroyd has been selected for this and we are pleased to include it here. Carry's print shows a red kite over one of the meadows looking north across the valley with the Grimston to Massingham Road hidden in the dip.

Carry says *"As a printmaker I work more in my studio than out in the field. I wander around making notes in the landscape and hope to then capture something of my experience before it fades from my mind's eye. The Heath has been wonderfully inspirational for me."*

The exhibition has a preview day on October 15th with official opening by musician David Gray and the public days are from the 16th to 25th.

CLIMATE CHANGE OR JUST A LONG HOT SUMMER?



Two species well worth looking out for are now resident in our parish.

The Ivy Bee (*Colletes hederae*)

This is a new arrival to the UK, first appearing on the south coast in 2001. It is a species of solitary bee, making its nest in sandy soils or banks, where it can form quite large colonies of individual bees. Feeding on the flowers of ivy, it usually appears from September to November when these plants are in flower. I spotted these on the ivy growing along our south facing wall. In the warm afternoon sunshine, the ivy flowers were alive with these busy workers collecting pollen and nectar.

The Wasp Spider (*Argiope bruennichi*)

This magnificent spider is a native of southern Europe. With the gradual warming it has spread northwards into the UK. I spotted my first one about fifteen years ago, where it was exciting naturalists in south Wiltshire. Now, it has become quite common on Massingham Heath. About 2cm long, once you have spotted one, it is quite easy to find more. Look for a bowl-shaped depression in long meadow grass, which the spider makes by spinning silk to pull down the grass stems. The spider then sits in the middle, waiting for its prey. Despite its fearsome appearance, they are quite harmless and will not bite or sting!

Our current development boundary is shown on the map.

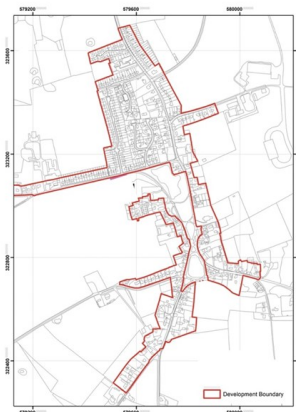
This could be adjusted by the Neighbourhood Development Plan to encourage more infill housing should landowners wish to apply to the Borough Council for appropriate planning permission. In general, there is a presumption in favour of development within the boundary compared to outside it. Consequently, selective expansion of the current boundary could encourage the small-scale increase in Great Massingham's housing stock that residents have told us they wish to see.

Playground Funding Progress – and How You Can Help

The Parish Council is pleased to share positive progress in securing funding for our community project. At the recent meeting, councillors approved the next steps for major external grant applications, alongside acceptance of funding already awarded.

- **National Lottery:** A second-round application is being prepared for up to £140,000.
- **FCC Communities Foundation:** An application will be submitted for £100,000, which requires matched funding and a local contribution of around £10,750 (known as “Contributing Third Party” support).
- **Rural England Prosperity Fund (REPF):** We have already secured a £50,000 grant, specifically allocated to playground improvements. The Council will now move forward with signing the acceptance documents.

These grants represent a significant step towards making the new playground a reality. However, unlocking the FCC Communities Foundation funding depends on us raising the £10,750 local contribution.

We’re delighted to share that, thanks to the generosity of a local business, £1,000 has already been pledged, leaving £9,750 still to raise. Every donation, large or small, will bring us closer to delivering this much-needed facility for children and families in our community. To help meet this target, a **Fundraising Village Fete will be held on Sunday 12th October at the Village Hall**. It promises to be a wonderful day full of fun, food, and activities for all ages, with every pound raised going directly to the playground fund.

External Audit Completed: Over the past month, the Parish Council’s annual accounts underwent an independent external audit carried out by PKF Littlejohn LLP, the appointed auditors for local councils. We are pleased to report that the audit has now been completed, and the auditors confirmed that the Council has complied fully with all proper practices and relevant legislation. Importantly, their review raised no matters of concern, which provides reassurance that the Council’s financial management continues to be sound, transparent, and well-governed.

The full external auditor’s report is available for parishioners to view on the Parish Council website and on the village notice board.

Parking on the Village Greens: The Parish Council has agreed to set up a dedicated working group to consider the issue of parking on the village greens. The group will review current challenges, relevant legislation, and best practice guidance, with the aim of developing a clear and fair policy for the future management of parking. Updates will be shared with residents as this work progresses.

Scotsman’s Pit and Post Office Pit Improvements: At the recent Council meeting, a programme of works was proposed at Scotsman’s Pit. This will include cutting back vegetation on the property side to the existing fence line, reinstating three swims, and clearing vegetation and trees along the north side of the Pit. The Houghton Estate, as the lessor, will also be approached to ask for assistance with any tree work around Scotsman’s Pit. The majority of this work will be carried out by volunteers, with the Council appointing a contractor to undertake specific tasks at Post Office Pit. Quotations for this contracted work are currently being sought.

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THE PHONE RANG.....at 01.40 on the morning of July 19th. The voice at the other end of the phone said: I am the Registrar at the Norfolk & Norwich HospitalI need you to come in immediately. I sat on the edge of the bed, the minutes on the bedside clock slipping by, I was alone - the call was about Vivien, I was unable to drive due to surgery on my arm.

I made a phone call which was answered by Jules. She picked me up and drove the 33 miles to the Hospital. A Team of six medics were waiting for me. Surgeon Mr John Phillips introduced himself, and said “We have no alternative but to perform a tracheostomy, and I have to advise you that there is a 25% - 50% chance that it will not be successful”. Please go ahead I replied - his words still sinking in, when the Anaesthetist said: “Due to timeframes I will not be able to administer an anaesthetic”. I understood I replied.

This article is more about the amazing people who came forward at our desperate time of need. Mr Phillips and his Team as well as the other Teams at the NNUH - who have been nothing short of amazing in every respect. As I write Vivien has been in NNUH for approaching seven weeks. The many people in Great Massingham with their offers of help, those whose help we were able to accept, those who constantly enquired after Vivien’s progress, have been incredible, and greatly appreciated. I visited Vivien every day in the first month, again the kindness of those who drove me to and from the hospital covering in excess of 2,500 miles and giving up 160 hours of their time. It is difficult to express our gratitude to so many people for the differing ways in which they offered help or gave help - as the saying goes - you know who you are! Thank you! ***Robin Arbenz***
