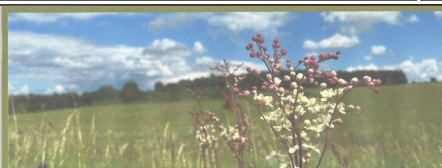

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GREAT MASSINGHAM PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council meeting on 12th August saw the attendance of seven councillors and ten members of the public. Key points discussed included:

Car Parking: The Council is considering installing protective matting on the village green to address parking issues and preserve its appearance. A consultation will be launched in the autumn to gather community feedback before any project is planned or progressed.

Play Area: The Council plans to implement a quarterly cleaning program for play equipment. Repairs to the Platform Roundabout have been completed, and support is sought for a funding bid for a new Roundabout. Residents are encouraged to review options and support the bid through letters. The range of options and pricing can be seen in the August Mallard (pages 8 & 9) or on the Parish Council website.

Flyposting: Following village events, residents are reminded of the importance of removing posters and signs from lamp posts, fences, and other public spaces. While these advertisements play a vital role in promoting community gatherings, leaving them up long after the event creates an eyesore and can contribute to litter. To put it in perspective a resident has very kindly spent many hours of their time removing these from various posts in the village and managed to recover 3lbs of drawing pins/staples! The Parish Council would therefore like to encourage all event organizers to promptly take down their posters within 48 hours of the event's conclusion.

Overgrown Hedging: Residents are asked to regularly trim hedges that overhang pavements to ensure pedestrian safety and comfort. Proper maintenance helps keep footways unobstructed and safe for everyone.

Councillor Community Grant Scheme: Borough Councillor A Beales has a £1,000 annual grant to support local community projects. The grant can be used for various initiatives including equipment, newsletters, and event contributions. For more details, visit the Borough Council of King's Lynn & West Norfolk's website.

Gray's Fun Fair: Gray's Fun Fair is expected to return to the village the week starting October 7th. Further details will be provided closer to the event.

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A SUMMER EVENING WITH THE MASSINGHAM HISTORICAL SOCIETY

Friday 16th August was warm and sunny, perfect weather for a Massingham Historical Society event that attracted 57 members and guests. The principal element was a comprehensive exploration of St Mary's Church. No less than five separate mini-tours were on offer that included a guided ascent of the tower led by Dale Gagen (see photo, opposite), who winds the church clock each week and bell ringer Mike Harding. We were also given an authoritative account of the windows, benches and more by John Vigor a national authority on medieval churches, while Ant and Jeanne Robinson gave guided tours of both the interior and exterior of the church. In addition, Stephen Hudson, the Churchwarden, put on a fascinating display of old handwritten registers of births, marriages and deaths. For many, the highlight was a descent, by ladder, into the bowels of the nave to examine the patented underfloor Victorian furnace and flue that heated the Church until the 1950s. Mervyn Skipper, who, as a young boy helped his father work the furnace, was on hand in the stokehole to tell his story (see photo, left) helped by a small team seeing us safely on and off the ladder.



A delicious BBQ of local burgers and hotdogs followed at the Village Hall and, if that was not enough, three short films were then screened showing something of post-war rural life in these parts. The first was a 1981 BBC production, shot mostly in Great Massingham, covering a day in the life of retired local farm worker Tully George. In one scene, Tully is tending St Mary's churchyard and recounts the story of a retired vicar who, at the age of 82, scandalously married a 22-year-old girl from

the choir! The second film gave us glimpses of the daily life of a veg grower from Cley who sold his produce from a donkey and cart. In the third film, a former old-time gamekeeper at Holkham shared his secrets for successfully dispatching rabbits using a ferret, a spade and a surprisingly sophisticated listening device.

The historical society committee is to be commended for arranging a very special and memorable evening that more than matched the peerless weather.

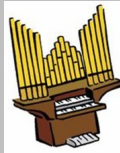

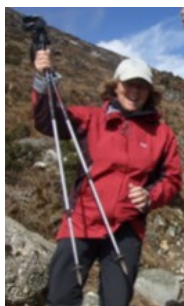

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BIODIVERSITY PROJECT NEWS

The walk around the village arranged by Project volunteers in late July served to highlight just how much wildlife we have. Visiting three ponds, the range of damsel and dragonfly species was noted by many, with up to six species being seen on the day and up to ten in the weeks since. These insects spend their larval stage in the ponds and rely upon the stems of water plants which they climb like a ladder, after which the larval skin splits open and the adult insect emerges. They have benefitted from the increase in true marginal plants at Scotsman's Pit and those fishing the pond report that they have enjoyed seeing them too.

A moth light trap had been run at Abbey House overnight and this produced over 65 individual moths of 23 different species. Most were common garden and woodland species but far from ordinary to look at! We also looked at life in the ponds and found two species of water boatmen, damselfly larvae, water beetles and small crustaceans. In the evening a group met to look for bats

around Scotsman's Pit, and the church, equipped with several sonic bat detectors. This enabled four species to be identified – common and soprano pipistrelles, noctule and Daubenton's bat. A final point of interest was a sparrowhawk perched on the church roof and no doubt aware of the emerging bats!
